THEOLOGY ROUNDTABLE is on vacation for the month of December. In January we will begin work on (drum roll) St. Thomas Aquinas, Doctor of the faith, and one of the 3 or 4 most important philosophers in world history.

St. Thomas integrated the Platonism that had always pervaded Christian theology with Aristotelian metaphysics, scaling the very greatest heights of thought. His philosophy is basic for all the Western Churches. His masterpiece is the *Summa Theologica*, a huge undertaking (for the reader, I mean). Our goals are more modest: the text we will use is *Summa of the Summa*, a beginner's introduction by Catholic theologian and apologist Peter Kreeft.

The Roundtable meets at 7:30 PM in Palache Hall each month (when we are not on vacation). Our next meeting is January 13, in accord with our usual practice of meeting the second Wednesday of each month. All are welcome at the Roundtable; no background in philosophy or theology is needed to profit from our discussions.
