THEOLOGY ROUNDTABLE is continuing yeoman's work on Aquinas' masterpiece, the *Summa Theologica* (in a Readers Digest abridgment by Catholic philosopher Peter Kreeft, *Summa of the Summa*). In our February meeting, we had a fascinating discussion on a single paragraph in St. Thomas's argument that the existence of God can indeed be demonstrated by natural reason (as distinct from revelation). So next session we will launch into his summary of the five ways that God's existence can be demonstrated. These arguments come quite early in Kreeft's version, so it is not too late for you to join us in discussing ten of the most important pages of philosophy ever written.

The Roundtable meets at 7:30 PM in Palache Hall each month. Our next meeting is April 14, in accord with our usual practice of meeting the second Wednesday of each month. All are welcome at the Roundtable; no background in philosophy or theology is needed to profit from our discussions.
