**THEOLOGY ROUNDTABLE** continues its exploration of the nature of God, using the most important work of the Angelic Doctor of the Church, St. Thomas Aquinas: his masterpiece the *Summa Theologica*. Rather than tackle the 3,000 page original, we are reading *Summa of the Summa*, by Catholic philosopher Peter Kreeft. Kreeft retains the most important of Thomas's arguments, adding copious and pellucid footnotes that explain Thomas at every step.
