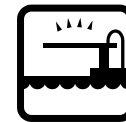


### AWARDS SUNDAY

**THEOLOGY ROUNDTABLE** continues with our exploration of the most important work of one of the most important saints in the history of the Church – and most important philosophers in the history of the world – the Summa Theologica of St. Thomas Aquinas. But instead of tackling the mammoth original, we are using a Readers Digest version by Catholic philosopher Peter Kreeft. Kreeft excerpts the most important arguments, adding copious footnotes to explain the technical terms of Medieval scholastic philosophy. Thomas himself is a remarkably clear and straightforward writer, as philosophers go. Our subject next time: more on the Nature of God.
