Lawrence Laboratory Researcher and President of the **DARFUR STOVE PROJECT**, Ashok Gadgil, won the Heinz Award for his contribution of the Berkeley-Darfur Stove. This stoves project seeks to improve the safety and livelihoods of women by providing fuel-efficient stoves which reduce firewood requirements, limit women's exposure to violence during firewood collection and decrease the use of money and food rations to obtain fuel. This last year, the Sunday School learned about Darfur and how these stoves can help those caught in conflict. Come by the table staffed by our young people on June 27 and purchase a stove that can save lives for only \$15 each.
