The Afro~Anglican Commission of the Episcopal Diocese of California in conjunction with the Northern California/Vivian Traylor Chapter of the Union Of Black Episcopalians cordially invite you, your family and friends to attend the 2011 Absalom Jones Celebration. Please join us on Saturday, February 19, at 11:00 AM, as we celebrate the life and legacy of the 1st African-American Episcopal Priest in the United States (1804).

The celebration service will be held at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Oakland, with fellowship in the Parrish Hall. Bishop Mark Andrus will be the eucharistic celebrant and the Rev. Dr. Kortright Davis of Washington D.C. will preach. A combined choir from St. Clement's, St. Augustine's, St. Mark's, and more will sing spirituals, gospel songs, hymns and anthems.

THEOLOGY ROUNDTABLE: At our session this week, we will begin discussing the moral philosophy of St. Thomas Aquinas. Our text is a distillation of St. Thomas' *Summa Theologica*, a 3,000 page primer for novices in theological study at the University of Paris. Catholic philosopher Peter Kreeft has assembled the most important arguments of the Summa into the 500 page *Summa of the Summa*. While we have been reading this book for quite a few months now, taking in the section on Ethics does not depend on first having learned everything that came before; so, just because you have not yet read any of the *Summa*, don't let that stop you. All are welcome at the Roundtable; no background in philosophy or theology is needed to profit from our discussions. We meet the second Wednesday of each month at 7:30 PM in Palache Hall.
