EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY

We are recruiting new members for the Education for Ministry (EfM) seminar. The recruiting season is May-June, although the 2011-2012 seminar will begin in early September. EfM combines the traditional functions of fellowship group and Bible study with a method of theological reflection, designed to help us make conscious connections between our faith traditions and the "post-religious" world we find ourselves in today. Over the course of 4 years, the seminar covers the Old and New Testaments, along with the history of Christianity and the development of our Episcopal theology.

We meet every Monday night from 6:30-9:00 PM; members of the group come from several East Bay churches, creating a broad community of learners and seekers. Cost is \$350 per year, with some scholarship help available. In the first few chapters, Feser examines our culture's philosophical inheritance from the ancient Greeks and medieval Scholastics, explaining aspects of their metaphysical thought that are hard for us moderns to apprehend. He shows how the modern materialist or dualist approaches to metaphysics introduce all sorts of philosophical paradoxes that the older systems handled with aplomb. Just one of those problems is the existence of God.
