## EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY

We are recruiting new members for the Education for Ministry (EfM) seminar. The recruiting season is May-June, although the 2011-2012 seminar will begin in early September. EfM combines the traditional functions of fellowship group and Bible study with a method of theological reflection, designed to help us make conscious connections between our faith traditions and the "post-religious" world we find ourselves in today. Over the course of 4 years, the seminar covers the Old and New Testaments, along with the history of Christianity and the development of our Episcopal theology.

We meet every Monday night from 6:30-9:00 PM; members of the group come from several East Bay churches, creating a broad community of learners and seekers. Cost is \$350 per year, with some scholarship help available.
