Holy Trinity Music School was crushed in the earthquake that took down the Episcopal cathedral in 2010.

Rebuilding Haiti's only school of music begins by hosting Les Petits Chanteurs—as our Diocese will do for seven concerts September 30–October 3. All parishes have been asked to help sponsor this seven-venue, relationship-building concert tour.

St. Clement's has already pledged over \$1500 toward this event. Seven individual donors have come forward, and the Vestry approved a gift from the Goode Ritson Fund.
