This selection, published in 2007, scores high on all three counts. It is not a particularly long book (only 159 pages), and is available from Amazon, as well as quick special order from bookstores such as Books Inc.

Starting at this earlier time gives us opportunity for a satisfying discussion and gets us all home at an earlier hour (most discussions end between 8:30 and 9:00 PM).

There is also a collection chest in Palache Hall for jam jars, sugar, and lemons. All donations welcome!

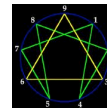

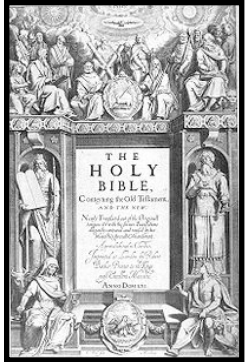
