Refurbishing of the Organ

Over the past several years, we have obtained quotes from vendors recommending that the organ be overhauled, but due to budget constraints, we have deferred taking action. Working with Swain & Kates, the firm that built and maintains our organ, we have determined that \$60,000 will be required for refurbishment.

While this seems like a daunting amount, we are fortunate to have already received gifts totaling more than \$33,000. You may make a pledge to this campaign by contacting any of us or the church office.
