

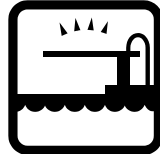


AWARDS SUNDAY

THEOLOGY ROUNDTABLE is working on a history of the Churches of the Middle East, Asia, and Africa. These were the churches that separated from the orthodox church (that of the Roman Empire, which later split between Orthodox and Roman communions) in the fifth century. These churches—in Syria, Iraq, Persia, Armenia, India, Egypt—may once have been larger than the orthodox church. But having been established in lands later conquered by Islam, their story has been unknown to our essentially Roman civilization. Over the centuries, they have been all but erased, victims of persecution, ethnic cleansing, and genocide. Their last remnants are even now fleeing the Middle East. Our text is *The Lost History of Christianity*, by Philip Jenkins.
