### Refurbishing of the Organ

If you've been listening carefully to the beautiful music on Sundays, you may have noticed some interesting noises emanating from the organ (even with Linda's skillful efforts to suppress them). Over the past several years, we have obtained quotes from vendors recommending that the organ be overhauled, but due to budget constraints, we have deferred taking action. We have been fortunate so far to have avoided a serious breakdown, but feel that we must act now to maintain the integrity of our music program.

Working with Linda and Swain & Kates, the firm that built and maintains our organ, we have determined that \$60,000 will be required for refurbishment. While this seems like a daunting amount, we are fortunate to have already received gifts totaling nearly \$17,000. You may make a pledge to this campaign by contacting any of us or the church office. Better still, you may make your donation now by either sending a check to the church office or leaving it in the collection plate (specify "Organ Campaign"). Envelopes are available at the back of the church.

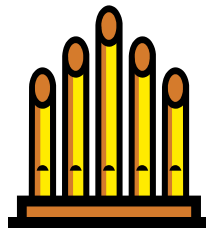

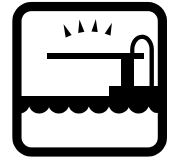


### AWARDS SUNDAY

**THEOLOGY ROUNDTABLE** is working on a history of the Churches of the Middle East, Asia, and Africa. **OPTIONS RECOVERY SERVICES** is a Berkeley non-profit treatment center providing substance abuse and mental health treatment for low or no-cost to homeless and disadvantaged people in Alameda County. St. Clement's has supported this organization, most recently by having an art show that benefitted the group.

They have been able to purchase an additional home to provide housing for some of their clients and need furnishings for it as well as their office. For the office they can use supplies, office lamps, cars and trucks to transport clients to programs.

For transitional housing, they can use blankets, sheets, pillow cases, towels, shower curtains, adult-size bunk beds, dressers, area rugs, lamps, electric washer/dryer, cleaning and gardening supplies, vacuum.
