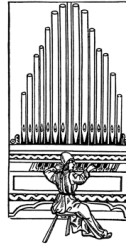

**THEOLOGY ROUNDTABLE** is wrapping up its work on *The History of the Church*, by Bishop Eusebius. An intimate friend and spiritual mentor to the Emperor Constantine, Eusebius wrote just as the theological dispute between Arians and Orthodox Christians was coming to a boil. He wrote the book between 305 and 311; the Ecumenical Council at Nicea, called by Constantine to settle the dispute once and for all, met in 325. Eusebius' *History* must have influenced many of those in attendance, for it was the very first comprehensive history of the personages, events, and doctrines of the early Church. It is therefore likely that Eusebius and his great work informed the most important product of that Council, the Nicene Creed we recite at each Mass.

The Roundtable meets at 7:30 PM in Palache Hall each month. Note well that **our next meeting is November 4, a departure** from our usual practice of meeting the second Wednesday of each month. All are welcome at the Roundtable; no background in philosophy or theology is needed to profit from our discussions.
