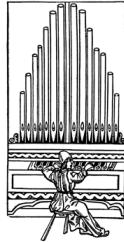

Update on the Organ Campaign!

TEEN CONFIRMATION: According to *The Book of Common Prayer* (page 412), "In the course of their Christian development, those baptized at an early age are expected, when they are ready and have been duly prepared, to make a mature public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their Baptism and to receive the laying on of hands by the bishop."

We are offering a teen Confirmation class beginning in early November, with an Easter season Confirmation at Grace Cathedral for those who are ready and willing. The minimum age recommended by our Bishop for Confirmation is 13. The class will meet monthly (with some "home-work") and be taught by the clergy and seminarians. THEOLOGY ROUNDTABLE is wrapping up its work on *The History of the Church*, by Bishop Eusebius. An intimate friend and spiritual mentor to Emperor Constantine, Eusebius wrote just as the theological dispute between Arians and Orthodox Christians was coming to a boil. The Ecumenical Council at Nicea, called by Constantine to settle the dispute, met in 325. Eusebius' *History*, written 305-311, must have influenced those in attendance, for it was the first comprehensive history of the personages, events, and doctrines of the early Church. It is likely that Eusebius and his great work informed the most important product of that Council, the Nicene Creed we recite at each Mass.

The Roundtable meets at 7:30 PM in Palache Hall each month. Note well that **our next meeting is November 4, a departure** from our usual practice of meeting the second Wednesday of each month. All are welcome at the Roundtable; no background in philosophy or theology is needed to profit from our discussions.
